It is important to have **proper foot-wear** for camp activities. Everybody should be wearing closed-toed shoes like sneakers, which should be worn even when walking to the pool area before and after swim. Pool shoes are useful for walking from changing areas to the pool.

Campers should always bring their bathing suits and towels to camp, even if the morning looks rainy. It often clears up to become hot and sunny!
